Abstract	James Jeffrey Roche was an Irish-born American journalist, author and diplomat. The collection consists primarily of letters written to Roche. Most of the correspondence is between Roche and Theodore Roosevelt. Other correspondents include diplomats, politicians and literary figures.

Biographical Note

James Jeffrey Roche was born to Edward and Mary (Doyle) Roche on May 31, 1847, in the town of Mountmellick, Queen's County, Ireland. In the same year, he immigrated with his parents to Prince Edward's Island, Canada. Roche grew up in Charlottetown, where his father, Edward Roche, a noted mathematical scholar, conducted a school. He graduated from St. Dunstan's College, a Jesuit affiliated school.

Roche came to Boston in 1866 and for some years was engaged in business. He later served as Boston correspondent for the Detroit Free Press. In 1883, he joined John Boyle O'Reilly as assistant editor of the Pilot. In 1890, after the death of O'Reilly, Roche became editor of the Pilot. In 1891, he was awarded an honorary doctorate of laws by Notre Dame University.

Though most of his time was spent as an editor, Roche found time to publish poetry and prose. These works include: *Ballads of Blue Water and Other Poems* (1895), *Her Majesty the King* (1899), *Songs and Satires* (1887), and *The Sorrows of Sap'ed* (1904). He also wrote biographical works that included: *Life of John Boyle O'Reilly* (1891) and *The Story of the Filibusters* (1891). The latter explored the "adventures" of General William Walker.

Roche was a member of several Boston cultural and social clubs. These included the American-Irish Historical Society, the John Boyle O'Reilly Club, the St. Botolph Club, the Jury Club of Boston and the Papyrus Club. He was one of the founders and officers of the American-Irish Historical Society.

Roche was a close friend of Theodore Roosevelt. From 1905 to 1907, he served as the United States Consul in Genoa, Italy. He later served as Consul in Berne, Switzerland, from 1907 to 1908.

James Jeffrey Roche died on April 3, 1908 in Berne, Switzerland, after a period of poor health. His second wife, his son (Arthur Somers Roche) and daughter (Florence Roche) all survived him. He also left three brothers and two sisters.

Scope and Content Note

The James Jeffrey Roche Papers consists primarily of letters written to James Jeffrey Roche from politicians, diplomats, writers, artists, and religious leaders. Correspondents include: James Brendan Connolly, Grover Cleveland, Daniel Chester French, Cardinal James Gibbons, Michael Davitt, Edward Everett Hale, John Hay, Thomas Wentworth Higginson, William Dean Howells, Douglas Hyde, Sarah Orne Jewett, Arthur Lynch, Seumas MacManus, Theodore Roosevelt, Augustus Saint-Gaudens and Mark Twain. The largest body of correspondence is from Theodore Roosevelt. Another important body of letters are those written from the American sculptor Daniel Chester French concerning a memorial to John Boyle O'Reilly. The collection also contains newspaper clippings about Roche, manuscripts of two poems by Roche and a piece of paper with his autograph.

The letters written by Daniel Chester French concern a memorial to John Boyle O'Reilly. The subseries is arranged alphabetically by the last name of the correspondent. One letter written by a person whose signature is illegible has been listed at the end.
